We are excited to report the successful completion of the Cyangoga suspension trail bridge project. Thanks to generous support and engagement from Fhecor and Fundación Pryconsa, together with the local communities we were able to complete the construction of a 70 meterslong trail bridge, inaugurated in March of 2025.

The Cyangoga trail bridge now serves 2 communities with over 5,000 beneficiaries in the rural Gakenke District in the Northern Province of Rwanda. The bridge connects these communities to the nearest hospital, government services, markets, and both primary and secondary schools. The Cyangoga trail bridge now provides safe access for individuals who were once putting their lives in jeopardy to seek opportunity.

The following pages of this report will show the incredible impact the Cyangoga bridge has had on the communities surrounding it. We look forward to continuing our partnership in the years to come. Thank you, once again, for your support in providing safe access.

THE CHALLENGE

Globally, one in seven people lack safe, year-round access to the services and opportunities in their immediate surroundings, due to the lack of transportation infrastructure.

WHY TRAIL BRIDGES?

Trail bridges link resources and services to the people who benefit from them the most, serving as a single intervention that addresses a myriad of symptoms. Safe, reliable access impacts day-to-day behavior and influences long-term decision-making. Connecting rural communities is a cost-effective, efficient tool for improving livelihoods and well-being.





RWANDA TRAIL BRIDGE PROGRAM

Since 2012, hundreds of bridges have been built in partnership with local partners, also thanks to the program launched by Bridges to Prosperity in 2019, which aims to connect communities across Rwanda through a partnership with the Ministries of Infrastructure, Finance, and Economic Planning, and Local Government, with the common goal of providing connection for over 1,100,000 residents thanks to the construction of more than 300 bridges by 2027.



UGANDA TRAIL BRIDGE PROGRAM

B2P has been building bridges in partnership with the Ugandan government since 2017. In the first years of implementation, B2P Uganda focused on laying strong foundational partnerships with the Uganda National Roads Authority and Ministry of Works and Transport. Currently, B2P and the Government of Uganda are strategically planning an expanded partnership to drive development of rural transport infrastructure across Uganda.



ETHIOPIA TRAIL BRIDGE PROGRAM

The Leona M. and Harry B. Helmsley Charitable Trust has provided a generous grant in support of a three-year partnership between Helvetas and B2P in Ethiopia. The TRAIL-Ethiopia program seeks to replicate Helvetas' successful government-owned Amhara program in five additional regions, building the enabling environment to resource the construction of thousands of trail bridges and millions of kilometers in feeder trails in the country in the future and developing a global platform to share learnings and innovations. By the end of the program, we will have built 150 bridges, connecting over 1.3M people to critical resources.

Safe Access is Critical

Safe access is necessary to thrive.





The Mukungwa river is often flooded during the rainy season, being dangerous to cross. The members of the communities surrounding the bridge were risking their lives to reach the health center, the school, and the market on the other shore.

In the past years, multiple people were injured while attempting to cross the river.





Everyone of my family used to cross this river daily. Particularly during the rainy season, I fear for my children's life because I believed they might not return home alive. This bridge will change this for all the students in our community.





It was quite risky to cross the river at night. Sometimes the river made it impossible for us to go to the hospital, so we had to wait until the next morning. I am thankful for this bridge now as it will give us the ability to reach the hospital any time we need to.

We often have weddings and other ceremonies to attend on the opposite side of the river, but we couldn't cross the river in our ceremonial attire, so we had to skip the ceremonies to avoid wearing wet clothing. This was one of the difficulties the Mukungwa river brought. This bridge is an excellent way to help our community.


The team's dedication and tireless efforts have made a significant impact in improving the lives of countless individuals in the community.
